


## THE PURPOSE OF FLEET WATCH



# PORT ST. LUCIE POLICE FLEET WATCH PROGRAM

## HOW FLEET WATCH WORKS

Supervisors of all participating employers are alerted by a police bulletin, provided by the Port St. Lucie Police Department, if there is a need for assistance with a certain situation, such as;

- 1) Locating a lost child.
- 2) Searching for a serious suspect in a crime.

Fleet Watch participants are also requested to assist by reporting any public safety hazards observed, such as;

- 1) A vehicle accident causing injuries or road blockage.
- 2) Reckless vehicle operations.
- 3) Brush, structure, or car fires.
- 4) Downed trees or power lines.
- 5) Injured animals on roadways and walkways.

## FLEET WATCH PARTICIPATION

The Fleet Watch Program can involve any number of companies, including:

- 1) Public utilities
- 2) U.S. Postal Service
- 3) Tow truck operators
- 4) Waste management companies
- 5) Cable companies
- 6) Power companies
- 7) Telephone companies

These participating companies are the key to the Fleet Watch program's success. Participating vehicles are marked with an identifiable bumper sticker to inform the public that the vehicle's operator has been trained to report emergency incidents to law enforcement.

## PARTICIPATION REQUIREMENTS

All interested in the program must attend a training session prepared and presented by the Port St. Lucie Police Department Crime Prevention Officer. During this training, employees will be educated on suspicious activity recognition, proper reporting of observations to law enforcement and safety requirements which are pre-established between the Port St. Lucie Police Department and all participating companies.
